


On-Resistance vs. Drain Current






**Transfer Characteristics** 




Capacitance




On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature







Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage



**Threshold Voltage** 




Single Pulse Power, Junction-to-Ambient



Safe Operating Area




#### Note

a. The power dissipation P<sub>D</sub> is based on T<sub>J</sub> max. = 150 °C, using junction-to-case thermal resistance, and is more useful in settling the upper dissipation limit for cases where additional heatsinking is used. It is used to determine the current rating, when this rating falls below the package limit.




Power, Junction-to-Case
